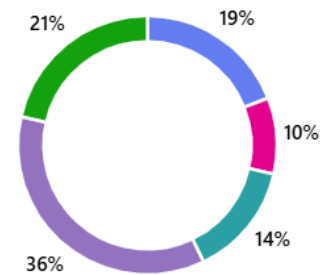


## Demographic data of referrals for Health Assessment, Q1 2026

During the first three months of 2026, TID offered 42 health assessment appointments to 41 individuals (in one case a client who did not attend his first appointment but was strongly suspected to be self-harming was recontacted, and he attended his second appointment).

Appointments were provided across all four projects:

● Solace	8
● Pafra (via Solace)	4
● Manchester Refugee Action	6
● Whitehouse Centre	15
● Abercrombie Family Practice	9



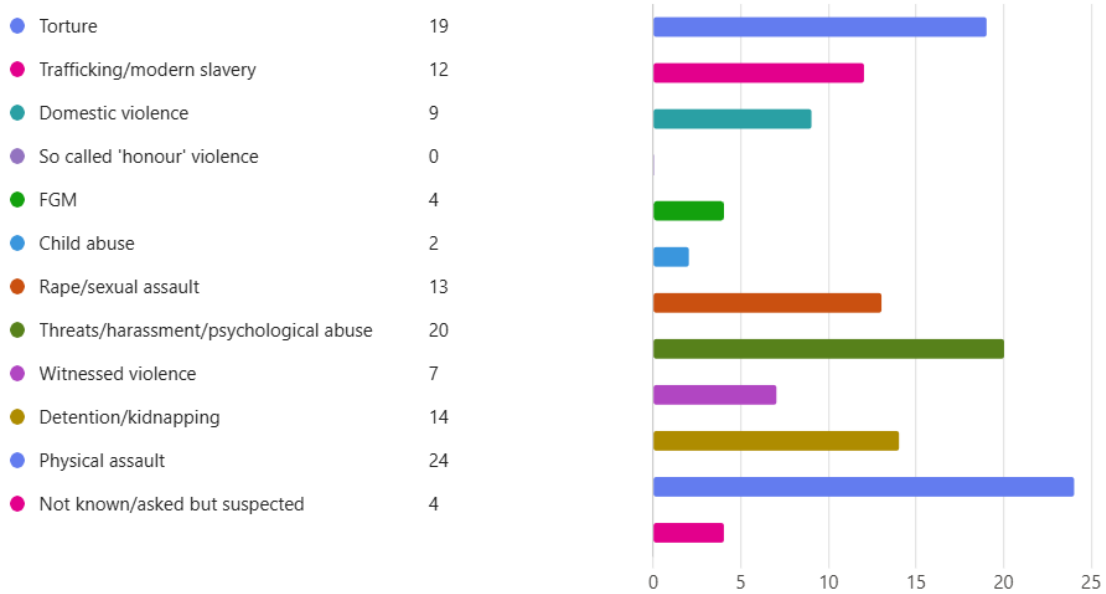
Five of the appointments provided were identified by the referrer as being urgent.

Twenty-three patients were male; 18 were female (none identified as non-binary).

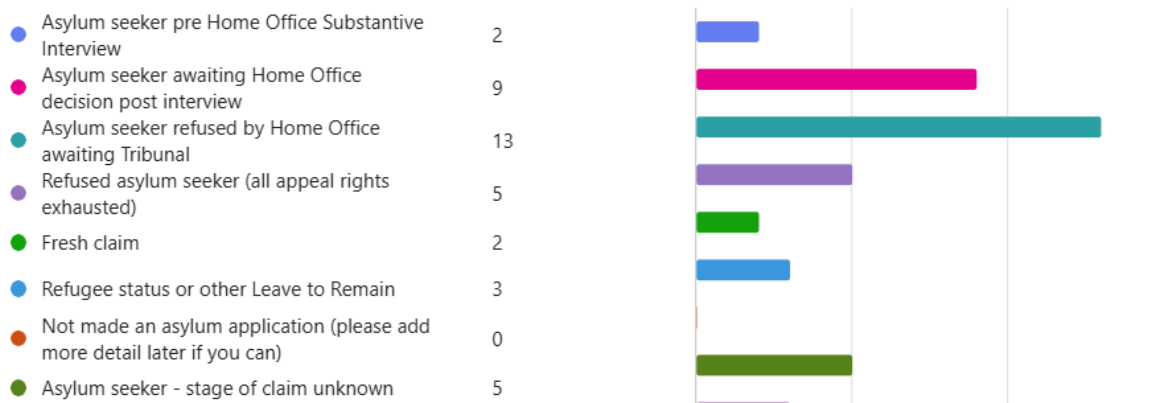

Referrers indicated human rights abuses as follows (note – pre-assessment, more may have been identified by the assessor):



In 89% of cases where information was given by referrers, clients were identified as having existing mental health conditions, including PTSD, anxiety and depression.

Clients were referred at various stages of their asylum journey:



Referrals were for a variety of reasons (multiple options possible), although the majority were in order to provide a longer appointment to enable exploration of human rights abuses and their health impacts:

Of the 24 cases where information was available, five were known to be in the NRM for modern slavery.
